We thank God for an encouraging visit during the last week of April by six members of RoAF's Horley team. We were able to 'show off' some of what we have been able to achieve, in terms of helping families, including those where the relationship is now based on friendship and co-operation, as well as those whose conditions are such that they continue to value our assistance.

The team had the opportunity to visit the various AN activities, including the office, shop and Casa Neemia. They also visited the warehouse on several occasions, preparing food bags and other items which they then took to various families. This allowed them to see a wide variety of the conditions that their support is helping to address. Many of the situations gave rise for questions, such as the visit to a small room where three young men live, one of whom sleeps on the mud floor. In this case, the young men each have behavioural problems which preclude them from being offered better accommodation elsewhere at present, although as individuals they are slowly responding to the attention and help that they get from the AN team

By contrast, one of the highlights of the time was a visit to an eighty-two year old lady who had become house-bound. We presented her with a wheel chair and she was able to come out into the sunlight for the first time this year. Her complexion visibly improved during the time that we spent with her and several of our visitors were visibly moved.

2. For beneficial feed back from our recent visitors.
3. For the new polytunnel that the residents of Casa Neemia are helping to construct – it will provide them with horticultural skills and food.

Please pray ...

1. About recent changes in European legislation that have implications for the way in which we monitor our activities. There is as yet no clarity as to how the legislation might be applied to small charities such as us.
2. For the young men mentioned above, that their progress may continue.
